

The minimum wage is due to rise to just over £8 in October.

This means that despite four decades of so called 'growth' and a low tax regime that benefits the well heeled, and ONLY the well heeled, Tynwald still imposes poverty base pay levels on a proportion of Manx workers.

Additionally there is a penalty imposed on younger workers with those below 18 years of age being subjected to wage related age discrimination.

This inequity is maintained by a Tynwald in which some members famously expressed a difficulty in sustaining themselves on an income of £50,000 a year.

It is a cabal of politicians already enjoying bumper salaries, expenses, paid holidays overseas and a subsidised canteen.

To all members of Tynwald - It's not a joke - it's a disgrace that you allow such inequality and exploitation. We say £10 now and that's the MINIMUM!




TRAIN WITH THE RAF USE THE ISLE OF MAN AIRPORT GO TO YEMEN - KILL CHILDREN!

CHARITY BEGINS AT HOME

This Island has well over a 1,000 registered charities of many types, many of them doing splendid work to address needs of many types, usually dependent on volunteers and supported by very generous public.

A number of Island charities concentrate on those who find themselves in desperate circumstances and who need some kind of help. Has the government lost its way, prioritising the rich over the poor, over those who have to struggle and depend on the so called "Third Sector", for the most basic needs of life? Raising the pay of the poorest by a few pence tells you all you need to know.

Surely one of the most basic needs is having enough to eat. Since our visit to the Manx Food Bank Centre at Cronkbourne last year, Mec Vannin has learned a great deal about its operations to provide what has become a vital lifeline to many who need temporary assistance, and the care they take to ensure the help goes to those in real need. How shameful that our country needs food banks to provide the staff of life - demand continues to grow! The rich become richer - Mec Vannin does not need to finish the phrase.

The food bank faces problems on two fronts: It needs staple foods that are fit for human consumption. Supermarkets are an obvious source since they dispose of so much food simply because it has gone past an arbitrary "BEST BEFORE" date, but our understanding is that the support from the supermarkets in the Island is vary variable.

The second problem is money. The charity has to spend many thousands a year on rent, rates and insurance. There is an Isle of Man Food Bank donation bucket on this year's Mec Vannin Tynwald Day stall and information leaflets.

Why is the fair tucked away out of site of the hill so that the participants can't see what's happening?

That happened in 1979, the year allotted to be "Millenium Year". Yes, the very year that claimed to celebrate 1000 years of the Tynwald completely destroyed the integrity of the occasion and it's been that way ever since.

Why is the God Save the Queen played when we aren't in the UK and we don't have a queen? Well, we still want to keep this suitable for minors so, no comment ...

DOES MEC VANNIN OPPOSE 5G?

At its recent AGM, the Party passed a resolution calling upon the government in the Isle of Man to impose a moratorium on the implementation of 5G until serious concerns regarding potential dangers were addressed.

As part of this, we wrote to the current Director of Public Health, Dr Henrietta Ewart, who had already publicly dismissed any notion that there were potential health risks associated with 5G.

But what is 5G and why is it different to any other "G"? It is a wireless transmission system that uses microwave frequency radio waves to transmit data. So do the existing ones, but at a relatively much longer wavelength. This is the problem. It's very nature means that a much "denser" network is required, particularly in built up areas, because solid objects absorb the signals and their energy far more readily than existing networks.

The World Health Organisation's Fact Sheet states, in relation to these emissions:

"The electromagnetic fields produced by mobile phones are classified by the International Agency for Research on Cancer as possibly carcinogenic to humans."

The Council for Europe issued a still standing Resolution (1815) in respect of ALL radio frequency emissions, part of which states:

"6.The Assembly regrets that, despite calls for the respect of the precautionary principle and despite all the recommendations. declarations and a number of statutory and leaislative advances, there is still a lack of reaction to known or emerging environmental and health risks and virtually systematic delays in adopting and implementing effective preventive measures. Waiting for high levels of scientific and clinical proof before taking action to prevent well-known risks can lead to very high health and economic costs, as was the case with asbestos, leaded petrol and tobacco."

Dr Ewart's response was to dismiss the Council of Europe resolution since it did not explicitly mention 5G!

She also dismissed public scientific studies that indicated cancer and fertility risks associated with these specific frequencies because some of the research relied on animal testing, yet a huge amount of the work that she has relied on throughout her career is based on animal testing.

Nearly all published research that DOESN'T cast doubts on 5G is industry funded. Dr Ewart has adopted an entrenched position that flies in the face of the best we have to impartial positions on 5G.

The government in the Isle of Man has now taken the whole matter "up a notch" and is looking to steam roller 5G through with a relaxed planning framework. On the question of the health implications, it will hide behind Dr Ewart's pronouncements which, in our opinion, do no credit to herself or the position she occupies. It will also hide behind the fact that the UK is already conducting limited trials of 5G networks.

So, in conclusion, we aren't saying that 5G IS dangerous. We are saying that there is good evidence to say that it could be and, in line with the the Council of Europe's resolution 1815, *the precautionary principle should be applied.*

TYNWALD FINALLY ACKNOWLEDGES A NEED TO REDUCE CARBON EMISSIONS. WHY DOESN'T IT START BY SCRAPPING THAT INSANE FLY PAST?

Ever since the fair was shovelled to the back field in 1979, the members of Tynwald have continuously bitched about the fact that the fair makes too much noise for them when they think that something "important" is happening.
